News from Kindergarten

Thank you for all of your patience and understanding as our Kindergarten year has started remotely! During the month of September we have enjoyed seeing the children through Google Meets. We appreciate that students are up and ready to learn by 9:00 am, and they are attentive and ready to learn during group sessions. We encourage you to practice having your child wear a mask, practice social distancing, and washing their hands for 20 seconds (sing ABC song or birthday song). Just like when you are out and about, Ridgedale has incorporated floor markings to indicate direction for social distancing.

When we begin In-Person Learning, we will be communicating through their yellow communication folders. On the days your child is learning from home, the E-Learning calendar will guide them through the curriculum for the day. For example: if your child's at-home day is Tuesday he/she will complete assignments for Tuesday only, if it's Wednesday do Wednesday only etc. Please remember to check the yellow communication folder for any

additional work or information.

If and when we return to school, Kindergarten recess will be in the morning before lunch. Please dress for the weather accordingly. Also, remember to send a change of clothes to keep in their locker. Review your child's teachers Virtual Open House slide show to preview important information before returning to school. News from First Grade

The First Grade Team would like to thank parents and students for their cooperation and support through remote learning. We couldn't do it without you!

When we return to school, please teach your child this chant: Masks up, Back up, and Wash up! We will be teaching and practicing these routines to ensure the safety of everyone! Your child should wear a clean mask to school every day. (using a lanyard would be helpful too) Classrooms and hallways have arrows and pathways to ensure social distancing. We will be doing frequent handwashing. Please practice these routines at home too.

Our first-grade team will be working diligently on writing skills. Please encourage writing at home. You can make a grocery list, keep a daily journal, record the weather daily, or write a weekend plan.

Practicing sight words is also encouraged. You can write them in sentences, paint them or make the words with playdough (for a few ideas). Use what your child likes and be creative.

For distance learning, please refer to the Assignment Calendar and Google Classroom. You can refer to the letter sent home with Chrome books as well as your child's teacher for help!

News from Second Grade

Welcome to Second Grade! Even though we kicked off our school year remotely in an untraditional manner, we are off to a great start! It has been wonderful getting to know our students and parents. We want to thank all parents/guardians for their patience, flexibility, communication, and support as we work our way through these changes and challenges. We want to thank our students as well! They have been amazing in participating in our Google Meets and completing their assignments at home.

In reading we have been practicing sight words, reviewing phonics, and practicing a few comprehension strategies, such as sequencing and compare and contrast. In Math, we have been learning various strategies for addition and subtraction and using the Make 10 strategy. As we continue Unit 1 we will learn about odd/even numbers, arrays,

and solving 2-step word problems.

The students have also had many opportunities to practice their writing skills through journaling and writing a friendly letter. Soon the students will be taking the i-Ready Reading and Math Diagnostic that will provide data on their academic abilities and help the teacher plan instruction to meet each of their individual needs.

We cannot wait to get the students back into the classroom! Even when we turn, things will look a little different, but we are confident that everyone will adjust and we will make this a positive learning experience!

News from Third Grade

Our third grade Chargers have been doing a fantastic job with remote learning. We have overcome struggles and challenges. We will get through whatever this year brings us together, because we are CHARGER STRONG!

Students will be taking the iReady Math and Reading diagnostic test during the month of October. The purpose of this test is to get an idea of your child's strengths and weaknesses. Please encourage your child to take their time and do their very best.

In reading, we will begin learning about story structure, inferring and predicting, using illustration to gather information about a text. They will be comparing and contrasting text to text. We will continue working on our personal narrative unit.

In math, we will continue to explore the properties of multiplication. They begin to focus on division and its meaning. We will begin to make connections between multiplication and division. Students will continue daily math spiral review. Please encourage your child to practice math facts.



News from Fourth Grade

Welcome back to Ridgedale fourth grade students and families! Although the school year started off differently this year than in previous years, it was great getting back into the classroom and seeing the children. The fourth grade teachers would like to express our appreciation for the patience and kind words our students and families have been offering us while we're all adjusting to virtual teaching. So far the students have been doing a wonderful job of attending meetings and completing their assignments. We understand that sometimes technology doesn't want to work when we need it to and that can be frustrating. Thank you for letting us know when you aren't able to access a meeting or assignment. Most of the time we are unaware unless informed by you.

Academically, we have gradually increased the workload over the last few weeks and will continue to do so until all subjects are being covered in the classroom. The topics discussed in math thus far have focused on place value and comparing numbers. We will move into addition and subtraction, rounding whole numbers, as well as multiplication and division over the next month. As for reading, we have learned about story structure and the author's purpose. The skills that will be covered next will be cause and effect, theme, and understanding characters. Grammatically we've covered nouns and verbs. We will move into adjectives, adverbs, and pronouns afterward. Remember there are weekly assignments available in spelling and a test on Fridays. Science and Social Studies will be the next and last content areas to be added to the school day. As a reminder, when our school is virtual each classroom/teacher has assigned Google Meet times for the day. If your child will miss one of the meetings, you should inform his/her teacher so they will not be marked absent. They will need to log into Google Classroom daily to complete and submit the assignments for that day.

TECH NEWS

This is a big year for the students in Monongalia County. We are now 1:1 in Kindergarten through 12th grade. Students in grades Kindergarten through second grades all have a cart with their chromebooks that will be kept in the classroom. Grades third through fifth have been bringing them home for a few weeks now. Things seem to be going really well with the students being responsible, safe, and respectful. Keep up the great job!

Students in all grades can access MYON at home and at school. MYON is an online reading program that the county has purchased and includes thousands of books of various levels and subjects. The username for myon is the student's WVEIS number and the password is read.

All students can also access the IReady math program as well. It is part of the math adoption and provides lessons tailored to the student's needs based on the beginning year assessment. The username is the child's WVEIS number and the password is the student's full last name (all caps) and the two-digit birth month and day—no spaces. For instance, if my birthday was August 15th, my password would be TENNANT0815.

NEW DEFINITION OF STUDENT ATTENDANCE:

- Being present for learning opportunities provided to students:
 - A student is present for a learning opportunity when they demonstrate evidence of engagement with instructional content.
 - Physical presence in their classroom
 - Online interaction with teachers/peers.





In-Person Classroom Attendance

- If the student is present in their assigned classroom, they are present for the learning opportunities provided there.
- Tardiness and missing part of the day will count as a tardy/half day absence.

Virtual School Attendance

- Outside of the physical school building and are presented by WV Virtual School instead of the county school district.
- Virtual Learning is self paced.
- A student is present for the virtual course learning if they BOTH:
 - Log in daily
 - Maintain a course assignment completion with 10 percentage point of "on pace" for the virtual course.
- Elementary students MUST participate in a weekly check-in conference with their WV Virtual school/staff.

Turning in Notes

- Notes must be turned in to excuse an absence.
- Notes can be turned into the school or they can be filled out online on the individual schools website.

Remote/Distance Learning Attendance_

- Outside of the physical school building and presented by the student's MCS teachers and school staff.
- A mix of real time and individual assignments, including Arctic Academy.
- A child is present for remote/distance learning if the student:
 - Logs in and participates
 - Completes assigned daily learning opportunities by the due date set by the teacher/school.

If connectivity or technology issues prevent a student from being present for remote or distance learning opportunities, the family must contact the school as quickly as possible to arrange corrective action and possible make-up opportunities for those learning opportunities.

MONONGALIA COUNTY ATTENDANCE POLICY

In Person/At Home (Blended) Learning Schedule for Grades PK-5 October 1-November 6, 2020

For households with multiple last names, the entire household should follow the schedule for the last name of the oldest child in grades K-12.

This schedule is for students grades PK-5, pending further information from WVDE and the Monongalia County Health Department. In general, PK students do not attend on Fridays. Friday October 2 is an exception.
