News from First Grade

Our first grade team is looking forward to some great learning this winter season! Using technology is a great tool to practice and enhance learning especially when more time is spent inside. Here are some ideas you can try:

- 1. Sight word practice: Find a sight word apps you can try. "Kids Learn Sight Words" is a free one. Another is "Sight Word Ninja". It's best to engage in the app with your child to ensure they understand the directions.
- 2. Listen and read books on MyOn. Go to our school webpage (res.mono.k12.wv.us), then "Students", and "Student links". There your child can access MyOn, I-Ready, and other websites. Your teacher can provide login information if you need it.
- 3. Coding: Students can go to Code.org and practice this relevant skill in this age of technology!

To finish up Term 2, students will be working on strategies for adding three numbers and making a ten in Math. They will continue to work on opinion pieces in Writing and story elements in Reading. Thank you for your support and helping your child succeed!!

News from Second Grade

We are off to a great start to 2020 in second grade! The students wrote their resolutions and set goals to become successful learners and citizens. January was a busy month as we got back into our routines and took some middle of the year assessments. The students completed the iReady benchmark and running records. The results from each of these assessments will show how your child is progressing as well as help guide the instruction for your child. Report cards will be coming home on February 24. In math, we continue to practice place value of three digit numbers as well as adding and subtracting. Looking ahead in math, our next unit will be on Measurement and Data. Just a reminder that our Friendship/Valentine's Parties will be throughout the week of February 10-14th

News from Third Grade

Third grade students have just completed their middle of the year benchmark for I-Ready math. These data points serve as a great place to evaluate students' strengths, how much they've grown as math learners and concepts they can work on. Students can work on I-Ready math lessons both at home and at school. These individualized lessons are designed to help students meet their learning goals. As we work through our I-Ready lessons at school, our students will be moving forward with concepts related to two step word problems using the four operations, multiplication number patterns and sequences, and then we will begin with fractions. Third grade students will be participating in an Ice Cream Social at the end of year as a celebration of learning their multiplication facts, so please keep encouraging students to study their weekly facts at home.

We finished our novel study and many of our students thoroughly enjoyed stepping out of the reading book momentarily and into this class study. We will be returning to our Journey's book and working through the next few stories in our basal. As part of our third-grade standards, students will be working on some researched based projects in class, focusing on informational text, text features, comparing and contrasting, and citing text-evidence. Stay tuned for more details!

The next few weeks are usually our most unpredictable when it comes to the weather. Please be sure to review procedures for Arctic days. If we happen to have an Arctic day, students will need to have their Chromebooks to complete their assignments. Staff will report on Arctic days, so if you have questions reach out! Stay warm and think SPRING!



News from Fourth Grade

Welcome back from the holiday break! Fourth grade students were able to slide right back into the normal classroom routines without much difficulty. Over the past few weeks, we've picked back up in reading with our Journeys reading stories and skills while math's focus has shifted to fractions. During social studies, we've finished with the causes of the American Revolution and are now looking at the battles. Once complete, we will shift into the Westward Movement. In science we will continue to focus on sound and light waves. Afterwards, we will begin learning about the Earth's systems.

Students were given information about the Invention Convention upon returning from break. Expectations concerning the invention, booklet, and display board were previously discussed with all three classes. At this point, their proposal page should be submitted and each child should have their own invention booklet. Students will need to create a work timeline for themselves along with parent assistance if needed. The display board and model invention should arrive at school on Monday, March 9th. The Invention Convention itself will be held in the gymnasium on March 13th. Once more decisions have been made, we will provide more information regarding time. Technology News

Just a few little things about technology (specifically for our 3rd-5th graders with chromebooks):

- Remember that our chromebooks should be handled carefully, both in and out of the sleeves. Out of the sleeves, they should be carried with two hands. In the sleeves, the shoulder strap should go cross the body diagonally. In either situation, the chrome book should gently be placed flat on surfaces.
- There should never be food or liquid around the chromebooks. Liquids could fry the insides and food can become stuck underneath the keys, make the keys sticky, and cause glitchiness and problems with the machine itself.
- Remember to not leave the chromebooks outside in a cold vehicle for long periods of time, as that it can do permanent damage to the battery.
- Although there are many fun games and activities, they are NOT to be used for non educational purposes. Please be sure that sites and usage is monitored at home, just as they are at school.

• Finally, students need to make sure that they have their chromebooks charged and brought to school each day ready to use. Chromebooks are educational tools, just the same as textbooks, paper, and pencils that students need each day to be successful

ROBOTICS.....IT'S WHAT'S HAPPENING AT RIDGEDALE!

Ridgedale Elementary has added a new extracurricular team this year and they are electric! For the first time ever, Ridgedale had eight fifth graders who competed with other 4th - 8th graders in West Virginia in the First Lego League. The team met weekly during the fall to design a robot that could complete multiple missions. Each mission represented a different way that engineers make our cities safer and more efficient. The team also completed a research project designed to make our planet better. The team partnered with Engineers Without Borders to recreate a wooden press used to turn cardboard boxes into wooden fire logs. On November 16, the Robo Chargers traveled to the West Virginia School for the Deaf and Blind in Beckley to compete with thirteen other teams at the regional qualifier. The team took home the Robot Design - Best in Show Award and earned a spot at the state invitational at Fairmont University on December 7. With the help of their teammates and mentors, Mrs. Ray, Mr. Finley, and Ms. Tenant, the novice team was able to leave a lasting impression on the judges. Although the team did not advance to worlds, our Chargers scored high marks in all categories. The team is looking forward to continuing their recycling efforts next season and coming back stronger than ever!
